

The Literacy and Basic Skills Program (LBS) is an exciting and interesting program for adults who want to gain skills to enhance employability, independence, or go on to further training.

FOR ADULT LEARNERS 19+

Eligibility: Adults 19+, residents of Ontario, who need to upgrade skills in reading, writing, or math in order to pursue goals. Students must have sufficient English language skills to participate fully - this will vary by program.

Prepare for PLAR testing to help you accumulate credits toward your OSSD. ESL learners need a CLB Level of 5 in Reading and Writing. Prior Learning Assessment and Recogniton (PLAR)

Elementary Program

FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES JK to 8 DURING 2024-2025

Offers children the opportunity to develop and/or maintain the ability to speak, listen, read and write in a new language or the language of their heritage.

- Improves communication skills in their language of choice.
- Strengthens cognitive development through the knowledge of an additional language.
- Provides opportunities to learn and experience another culture.

Important Notes:

- A materials fee/course will be collected upon registration up to \$35 depending on the cost of the workbook.
- A fee of \$200 per course is required for Visa students and visitors and must be paid in advance at the Hill Park Learning Centre.
- All NON-HWDSB Students will be required to complete a School Registration form and provide proof of eligibility.
- If taking more than one class in the same language, a fee of \$200 per student per additional course is applicable.
