A Baltimore native, she lived in Tuscany, Italy, for over 20 years, where she had two children (one of whom has a cochlear implant). Jodi is a founding member of the Global Coalition of Parents of Children who are Deaf and Hard of Hearing and an online forum that supports over 15000 families of children with hearing loss. She was also instrumental in promoting and instigating newborn hearing screening in Italy.
