Our first half of the year was busy with focused continuous professional learning in reading and math. As a faculty, we have been learning how to use three teaching strategies in particular to help our students learn: ongoing formative assessment, anticipating student responses, and noticing and naming the learning. This will continue in January as all of our grade teams will be working collaboratively to implement math activities designed at the December PA Day. In addition, our Reading Specialist will be working with grade one teachers on assessment practices, and system-based staff will continue to provide support to staff in the development of strategies and programs for our most vulnerable students.

Last term, we also improved our back playground by removing a section of asphalt and planting new gardens and trees. In the spring, we shall start the next phase of the project and create the outdoor learning space. We are excited to embrace these challenges and thank you for your continued support.

Illustrated Guides provide visuals of key mathematical concepts that highlight the expectations for each grade. Grades 1 to 3 are available.

Working in Number Sense (WINS) activities are designed to deepen understanding and build fluency of mathematical concepts through the use of the mathies learning tools and games. The following topics are available: Counting; Composing and Decomposing Numbers; Representing, Comparing and Order-ing Numbers; and Multiplication and Division.





The Math Storytime app and website are de-signed for parents to explore math concepts with their children (ages 5 to 7) through stories. The following stories are available: Oh, Ducky Day!; Mina's One-Minute Mystery; The Ruler of the Rutabaga; Nuts About Maps; Drag-

on Surprise; Living in 3D; The Eggstrava-gant Problem; The Top Banana




Doing Mathematics with Your Child provides tips and hands-on activities to support the development of math-ematics K to 6 at home and in your community.
