



CHECK OUT SOME GREAT ONLINE MATH RESOURCES

Math Storytime (Grades K-2) The Math Storytime app and web site are designed for parents to explore math concepts with their children (ages 5 to 7) through stories.

What is my Child Learning in Math? (Grades 1-3) These illustrated guides highlight overall and specific expectations by grade level. They provide visuals of key mathematical concepts, tips about the math for parents, and sample activities that can support student learning at home.

Working in Numbers Sense (Grades 1-3) Activities are designed for you to engage with your child to deepen understanding and build fluency of mathematical concepts.

<u>Doing Mathematics with your Child (Grades K-6)</u> The activities in this guide were selected to help your child see math in everyday activities. They also build on children's love of games. And they support the learning expectations in the Ontario mathematics curriculum. This guide is available in 13 other languages.

<u>Guides to Effective Instruction (Grades K-6)</u> These guides for grades K-6, provide practical applications to help students achieve the curriculum expectations in mathematics.

<u>Home Connections (Grades 1-6)</u> Home connections are printable Grade 1 to 6 mathematics activities to connect the learning in the classroom to experiences at home.

Inspiring your Child to Learn and Love Math (Grades K-8) A tool kit for parents of children in the elementary grades in Ontario. The goal of this resource is to provide research-based information to help parents strengthen their own knowledge and understanding, as well as confidently support their child's learning in mathematics.
