- Holiday market:
 - Big thank you for holiday market! Lots of excitement. Lots of help. Wonderful way to kick off holiday season.
 - Senior students helped out with the younger students.
 - o Funds raised: \$1649.50 + \$70 for additional sales
- 2019-20 Elementary Student Achievement Report: Progress reports: Gr. 1-5
 - Language: progress distribution
 - Grade 1: 35.3% progressing with difficulty, 50.0% progressing well, 14.7% progressing very well
 - Grade 2: 14.8% progressing with difficulty, 77.8% progressing well, 7.4% progressing very well
 - Grade 3: 20.8% progressing with difficulty, 58.3% progressing well, 20.8% progressing very well
 - Grade 4: 26.1% progressing with difficulty, 60.9% progressing well, 13.0% progressing very well

- Grade 5: 15.2% progressing with difficulty, 60.6% progressing well, 24.2% progressing very well
- With most grades, except grade 1 have met target of 75%
- Anticipate that by end of year, should meet targets
- Some parents have raised concerns with focus on primary students but data do support this investment
- LLI still in place in Gr. 1
- LRT available to support Gr. 2 children, group reading
- For Gr. 2-3 Children receive EMPOWER intervention
- Gr. 4-5: no intervention from LRT. Receive support from classroom teacher and system LRT. LRTs targeting Gr. 1-3
- Question re: looking at curriculum for literacy support in kindergarten since there seems to be a big leap from kindergarten to grade 1.
- Current process for requesting additional support for literacy → teachers need to submit electronic request to Board, then decision gets made re: support and sending system LRT out to consult.

Discussion:

- Discussed potential to host literacy event like the Math event School Council hosted last year
- Gr. 1 teachers interested in a literacy event
- Balanced literacy diet is a resource that Mrs. Rodney uses to talk to staff about literacy strategies https://www.oise.utoronto.ca/balancedliteracydiet/Home/
- Website gives expectations by grade level
- Question re: engaging older students to build literacy in younger students
- Discussed exploring external literacy supports that School Council may want to invest in
- PRO grants will be available again this year. No details about focus, amounts. Information will be sent to Mrs. Rodney and School Council Chairs when funding cycle launched.
- Mathematics: progress distribution
 - Grade 1: 14.75% progressing with difficulty, 76.5% progressing well, 8.8% progressing very well
 - Grade 2: 3.7% progressing with difficulty, 88.9% progressing well, 7.4% progressing very well
 - Grade 3: 12.5% progressing with difficulty, 66.7% progressing well, 20.8% progressing very well
 - Grade 4: 13.0% progressing with difficulty, 78.3% progressing well, 8.7% progressing very well

- Grade 5: 9.1% progressing with difficulty, 75.8% progressing well, 15.2% progressing very well
- Doing a lot better in math with distribution on student progress in math
- Most of kids who are struggling with math are also struggling with literacy.
- By Gr. 2 or 3, these children may be placed on an individual education plan and then those children will have their own progress indicators.

Job action

- ETFO sets pace of progression of job action
- There may be some changes over the holidays
- OSSTF Mrs. Cochlin is part of OSSTF, as is psychologist, social workers, IT supports
- Catholic teachers associated have filed no board report in a legal strike position as of Thursday
- Currently in 2nd phase of job action not handing out any letters, not attending any meetings unless released to do so, are still meeting with parents on request, not doing things that are Board mandated; any work on school improvement plan is considered struck work; school council meetings are struck; report cards (Jan. 24th planned to be elementary school report writing day); teachers can no longer be in charge, in context of administrator absence.
- Children should see few changes as a result of job action, if any.
- Pizza days will continue with job action
- Website issues many older materials got lost; challenges with being able to update
 website; Mrs. Rodney is working on getting website updated and being able to post
 information.
- Library donations need to go through a process to get bar-coded
 - Library will start to cull outdate library books (e.g., >20 years old; classics may be retained)

9. Teacher Update (Michelle) (10mins)

- Teacher update – provided by Mrs. Rodney: Playground designs will be available in the new year

10. Financial Update/Budget Committee (Hilary/Rebecca/Majdi) (10mins)

- Budget committee met on Dec. 2 (Hilary, Rebecca, Majdi, Michelle, Linda)
- Discussed funds raised to date, reviewed projected expenses
- Discussed what expenses would be covered by the school's budget vs. school council funds
- Major requests biggest groupings books, technology
 - Subsidy for trips repeatedly comes up money to offset costs to families
 - o Priority that teachers can plan trips they want to plan

- o Reasonable price, that all children can participate
- Suggest additional funds allocated to subsidy: additional \$1000
- o Technology should be a school plan
- Council will support purchase of books variety of levels, graphic books, author visit has a lasting effect for council and kids in the school

Recommended items to be approved:

- \$5,000 back playground hard cap on spending
- \$2,000 trips
- \$2,000 for books \$200 per classroom, \$400 for library
- \$1,500 for speakers purchased on Cyber Monday
- \$500 Library investment separate Osmo kits X4 @\$89/kit (Best Buy price)
- Total: \$11,000
- Good alternative to allow teachers an opportunity to make a decision on what is needed for classroom
- Good idea to update outdated books e.g., outdated gender/racial perspectives; parents need to earmark books that are outdated, no longer appropriate
- Decision: all voted in favour of budget recommendations proposed by budget committee

11. Fundraising Committee (Pizza/Holiday Market) (Amy/Megan/Sabrina aka *The Dream Team*) (10 mins)

- Learned setting up the night before worked well, tables were needed, staggering stuff worked well
- Need 1 more table and two more adults for wrapping
- Next year, won't ask for wrapping paper donations, will ask for gift bags
- May want bags to help students with their shopping carrying many gifts, waiting to be wrapped
- Spirit wear should be in this week.

- Brent will follow up with Bob Avery in new year re: state of school washrooms

13. Environmental Stewardship Committee Update (Outdoor Learning TD Update, Eco School Designation) (Steve/Brian) (5mins)

- Ecofriendy school designation on hold until job action is resolved.
- TD Green grants available to reapply each year. Brian will follow up with Steve to discuss further. Can use a lot of same information finishing off what we started.
